Chairperson Edward Giobbe called the meeting to order and the proposed agenda was approved by consent.

**I. Approval of Minutes**

Dr. Ronald Wilder made a motion to approve the Committee meeting minutes from September 25, 2014 as presented. Dr. Rebecca Gunnlaugsson seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
